The Great Southern Touring Route is regarded as one of the world's best road trips.

This magical journey through some of the most exciting, enchanting and exquisitely different landscapes in Australia is found in the south-west of Victoria.

Magnificent Melbourne, the cosmopolitan capital with its dramatic towers, art galleries, restaurants and great shopping, is a natural starting and finishing point.

Travel south-west to Geelong, an energetic and sophisticated waterfront city with a laid-back foodie culture. Stretching just beyond Geelong, the beautiful Bellarine Peninsula boasts an eclectic mix of boutique wineries, rural charm and seaside villages.

The romance of the Great Ocean Road, with its rugged coastline, lush forests and overpowering sense of freedom, is an unforgettable experience.

The soaring mountains of The Grampians National Park have been the spiritual heartland of the Aboriginal people for tens of thousands of years.

Ballarat and its goldfields are a heady mix of the romance and majesty of the 1850s gold rush and a whole range of modern treasures.

Nourish the soul and restore your balance in Daylesford and Macedon Ranges, where spa country meets natural bushland, and quaint villages are brimming with an artsy vibe and quirky creations.

Native Australian wildlife abounds across the region including kangaroos, koalas, platypus, native birds and Australian wildflowers.

**MELBOURNE - ADELAIDE TOURING ROUTE**

The scenic routes between Melbourne and Adelaide take in some of Australia's best beaches, greenest forests, most amazing marine parks and dramatic cliffscapes.

When you add in globally recognised icons like the Great Ocean Road and Twelve Apostles, the Naracoorte World Heritage Fossil site and the place recently recognised as the number one island in Asia-Pacific, Kangaroo Island, these are journeys that just have to be undertaken.

**The Coastal Route** - Stunning seaside villages like Lorne, Apollo Bay, Port Fairy, Robe and Goolwa all add to the absolutely unforgettable experience - the journey of a lifetime - of taking a trip from Melbourne to Adelaide via the coast.

However, there is much more, including the magic of the Fleurieu Peninsula and its wineries, the Naracoorte World Heritage Fossil site and the grandeur of the world famous Great Ocean Road. So it's not difficult to see why this is one of the most popular drives in Australia.

**The Inland Route** - Taking the inland route from Melbourne to Adelaide is a golden opportunity to see some of Australia's finest countryside.

Leaving Melbourne the route travels first to the gold rush city of Ballarat with its rich array of grand colonial architecture and powerful claims to be the front of democracy in Australia. After learning the history of the Eureka uprising you reach another great uprising, the soaring mountains of the Grampians National Park. The collection of Aboriginal rock art is the biggest in South Eastern Australia. Hamilton is grazing country where the inhabitants still live off the sheep's back.

Across the border into South Australia and you're in the red centre - red wine centre that is - the Coonawarra. The World Heritage listed Naracoorte Caves, the Murray River and the charming Germanic village of Hahndorf are other highlights along the rest of the journey into Adelaide, the City of Light.
